Separate protected Parking facility for Cycles and Motor Cycles for both Boys and Girl Students was provided. All the Students are directed to park their Vehicles in the Respective places allotted to them.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

As the College is preparing for NAAC Assessment the Academic plan of the College has undergone through change and a new pattern will be implemented from this Academic Year. The Students will be classified in to three categories as above average, average and bellow average basing on their Performance in the University Examinations, and their Performance will be constantly monitored by the Respective Departments and constant ef- forts will be made to improve their Performance by assigning the above average Students to Research by giving Projects and to give assignments to average Students to improve their Performance and to start remedial coach- ing for the below average Students.

New Methods of Teaching will be Supplemented by Oral Lectures like using Overhead Projectors, MANA TV Programmes and by Guest Lectures and felled visits. The Students will be assessed by Three Unit tests During August, October and December of 2004 and a Pre Final Examination in the last week of January, 2005. It was unanimously decided by the Staff Council to arrange at least Three Guest Lectures and Three Field Visits to all the Classes During this Academic Year. It was also Decided to establish linkage

with local and surrounding Industries and to involve the Students in research work where ever Possible

GENERAL RULES OF DISCIPLINE

- 1. The Principal of the College has the complete power over the mainte nance of the Discipline of Students of the College.

- 7. If any Students discontinues his/her Studies from the College he/she should inform the same to the Principal at an early Date.

CONDUCT

Every Student shall wear a clean and decent Dress.

- 2. Every Student shall carry his Identity Card with him and show the same whenever he is asked to do so by any staff Member without the Identify Card he/she will not be allowed into the College.
- 3. Students are required to observe silence at all Times in the College and make as little noise as possible in moving from one Room to another.
- 4. Students are prohibited from loitering in varandas, campus or class surroundings during working Hours.
- 6. Smoking and Cycling within the College campus are strictly prohibited. 6 Scrubbing on the black board or wall is strictly prohibited and punishable.

- 7. On the teacher entering the class room, the Students rise and remain standing till they are asked to sit or till the Teacher takes his seat.
- 8 The Students shall be gracious and courteous to the Members of the

staff and are expected to greet them whenever they Meet them.

No Students shall be allowed to leave the Class Room without the permis sion of his/her teacher or until class is cancelled for Administrative reasons

- 10. Students who have no class in a particular period shall not disturb other classes at work. They should go either to Library or to the reading room.
- 11. A student who disturbs a lesson or makes mischief in a class may be expelled from the class by the Lecturer, The Students so expelled shall be deemed to be absent for that period. All such cases shall be reported to the Principal.
