INTRODUCTION

Social Innovation refers to the design and implementation of new solutions that imply conceptual, process, product or organizational change which ultimately aim to improve the welfare and wellbeing of individuals and communities.

According to the president of MAN (manufacturers Association of Nigeria) in 2014. As a manufacturer you are an entrepreneur although one may be an entrepreneur without being a manufacturer. However the common denominator is that both entrepreneur and manufacturer refer to the people who can identify gaps in the environment and develop such gaps into opportunities through innovation, take risks and add value.

SELF HELP GROUPS SHG BANK LINKAGE MODEL:-

After the United Nations launched the International year on microfinance (2005), microfinance became popular. It got further impetus when Prof. Muhammad Yunus, the founder of Grameen Bank of Bangladesh (1976) and Pioneer in microcredit for women was awarded Noble Peace Prize. Yet this concept is not strange to India with the initiatives of NABARD and SIDBI e in early 1990s. This concept came to the limelight in India.

SHG BANK LINKAGE MODEL:-

The SBLP model has emerged as the dominant model in terms of number of borrowers and loans outstanding in terms of coverage this model is the largest micro finance program in the world.

- Self- help group (SHG) is a small voluntary association of poor people, preferably from the same socio-economic background. They come together for the purpose of solving their common problems through self-help and mutual help. The SHG promotes small savings among its members. The savings are kept with a bank. and is in the name of SHG banks also issue yellow to the group after rating them based on their savings and internal credit behaviour. The SHG usually lend internally both before and after the linkage takes place. Usually the number of members in an SHG does not exceed twenty. The SHG bank linkage model is emerged as a micro finance business model in India. This model can be further classified into three groups.

1. SHG-Bank Linkage Model I: Banks themselves take up work of farming and nurturing the groups, their saving bank accounts and providing them bank loans.
2. SHG Bank Linkage Model II: SHG are formed by NGOs and formal agencies but are directly financed by banks.
3. SHG Bank linkage Model III: SHG are financed banks using NGOs and other agencies as financial intermediaries.

With a view to strengthen SHG movement, there is a tendency form SHG Federation. Typically about 15 to 50 SHGs make up a Cluster/Village Organisation (VO) with either one or two representatives for each SHG. Depending on geography, several Clusters or VOs come together to

form an apex body or an SHG Federation. A SHG Federation is a formal group of informal common interest groups. At a cluster and Federation level, there are inter-group borrowings, exchange of ideas, sharing of costs and discussion of common interests. There are typically various sub-committees including loan collections, accounting and social issues.

FEATURES OF MICROFINANCE TO MANUFACTURERS IN INDIA:

Indian microfinance sector has been making rapid progress. Some of the features of microfinance to manufacturers like SHG in India are as follows.

- SHG - Bank linkage model is the major microfinance model in its geographical coverage. This model is started as a pilot project in NABARD. It has become a movement now. It brought name and fame to India in the world of microfinance. Its number increased from 30,000 in 1992 to 6.6 million in 2021 March.

The number of poor families benefited through SHG increased from 24.3 million as on

- March 31, 2005 to over 32.9 million by March 31 2006. Out of three SHG Bank linkage models, Model II takes lion's share. Among financial Institutions commercial banks have the highest share in linkage with SHGs followed by RRB and cooperatives.
- Southern region obtains better linkage and secured highest loans by Bihar is having 10 lakh SHGs and occupies first place in number.
- Among the states, Andhra Pradesh occupies first place in terms of linkage and credit disbursement.
- More than 19 million masks have been produced by some 20,000 SHGs across 27 Indian states.
- At the end of March 2008, 2.9 million were having outstanding bank loans of Rs. 12,366 crores.
