Best Practices

1. Title: - Imparting Adult Education

2. Objective of practice: -:- To improve literacy in India in its true sense. Having observed that the literacy programs conducted by the government was only partially successful and the adult who were trained learned only few things beyond signature, the practice aimed to give true education, i.e., complete ability to read and write.

3. The Practice:- For this programme candidates from students were selected as teachers based on their interest. They were asked to identify the illiterates in their surroundings first Then a teaching program was chalked out for 100 to 150 hours. The material needed for learning was procured by the HOD of Telugu department. The program was started in the year 2020. This year the HoD, who was also the Coordinator of WEC of the college, collaborated with Adult Education Department of Krishna district, A.P. and started this Programme.

5. Evidence of success: - Nearly 30 adults were turned literate in the past few years. This year as the program was started on large scale, it's aimed that at least 50 more adults will be turned literates.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources required:-

The main problem is reticence by the adults. Money is required for procuring needed material. But this year it's supplied by the Adults Education Department.
