Report On World Aids Day 1/12/2025



1. Real Making Activity – 26 November 2025

Objectives

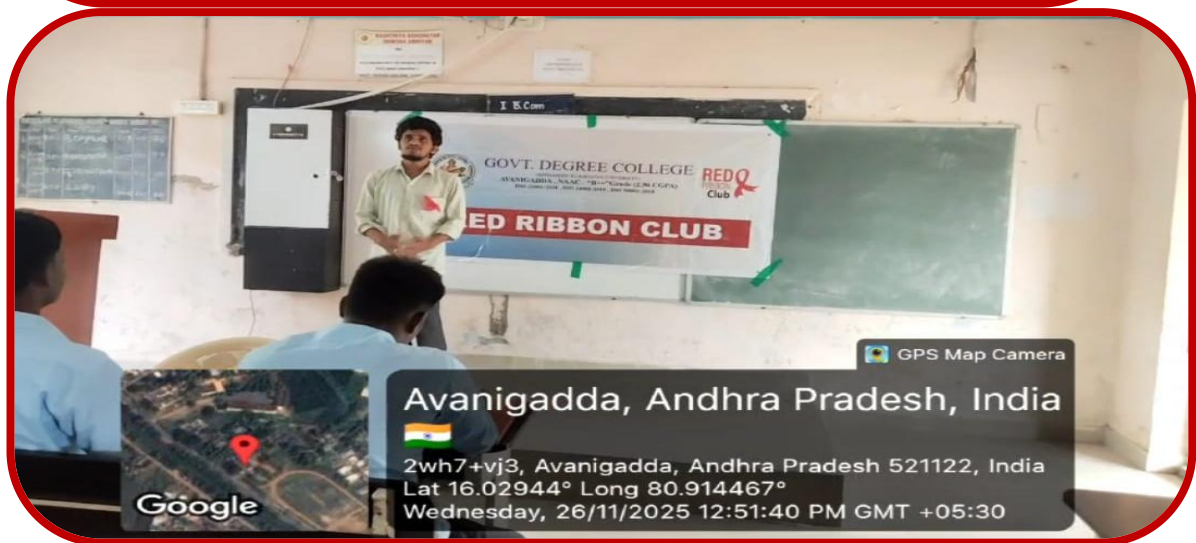
- To help students understand HIV/AIDS concepts through experiential learning.
- To encourage creativity in expressing awareness messages.
- To develop teamwork and participation in health education activities.

Description

A Real Making Activity was conducted where students prepared informative models and displays on the themes of HIV transmission, prevention, misconceptions, counselling, and healthy living. Groups used eco-friendly materials and presented their models to faculty and peers.

Outcomes

- Students gained practical understanding of HIV/AIDS concepts.
- Increased participation and teamwork among student groups.
- Models created served as visual aids for campus awareness.
- Improved confidence in presenting health-related information.

2. Poster Presentation – 26 November 2025

Objective

To spread awareness through visual communication.

To promote creativity in conveying social messages.

To sensitise students about stigma and discrimination faced by HIV-positive individuals.

Description

A Poster Presentation Competition was organised on the same day, where students created posters focusing on “Prevention of HIV”, “Stop the Stigma”, “Treatment and Care”, and “Role of Youth in Awareness”.

Outcomes

Students learned how to communicate health messages effectively.

Posters displayed around campus created an atmosphere of awareness.

Enhanced student knowledge of HIV prevention and safe practices.

Developed artistic and presentation skills.

3. Elocution Competition: “Equal Respect for People Living with HIV” 27 November 2025

Objective

To encourage students to speak on human rights and dignity.
To remove misconceptions regarding people living with HIV.
To promote respect, empathy, and social responsibility.

Description

An Elocution Competition was held on the theme “Equal Respect for People Living with HIV”. Participants delivered speeches focusing on equality, social inclusion, rights of HIV-affected individuals, and the importance of compassion.

Outcomes

4. Rangoli Competition – 28 November 2025

Objective

5. Rally & Human Chain Formation – World AIDS Day

Objective

- To spread awareness into the community beyond the campus.
- To show solidarity with people living with HIV.
- To promote collective responsibility for HIV prevention and stigma reduction.

Description

On World AIDS Day, a rally was organised with students marching through nearby streets carrying placards, slogans, and posters. Later, a Human Chain was formed symbolising unity and commitment to end discrimination and promote awareness.

After the formation, a Wax Lighting Tribute was conducted separately. Students lit wax candles as a mark of respect for the people who died due to HIV/AIDS. A short silence was observed to honour their memory. The candlelight created a peaceful and respectful atmosphere, reminding everyone of the importance of awareness, support, and a stigma-free society.

Outcomes

- Created strong community awareness about HIV prevention and respect.
- Students developed leadership, social responsibility, and civic engagement.
- Human chain visually symbolised unity and collective commitment.
- Strengthened the college's outreach and social service efforts.
